For French, GM-free, Identity preserved and sustainable soya

Why?

To get more value and to raise

awareness about advantages and quality of the French soya sector.

To provide certified products for users and

consumers : soybeans, soy oils, soy meals (products obtained after oil extraction), extruded and toasted soybeans, soy foods (soy drinks for example), soy-based food ingredients.

Ambitions

- **250 000 hectares** of soy crops in France by 2025-2030 to supply the French market
- Promotion of the French GM-free soya
- Supporting innovation and implantation of processing plants in France
- Strengthening technical advice for soya crop and improvement of local soya economic performances

4 main commitments

Made in France : soya is cultivated, collected and processed in France

GM-free : Operators take adequate measures and make additional analysis to guarantee the GM-free characteristics from the seed to the product



Traceability : Every step, from the field to the first processing products, is fully described and registered

Sustainability : Soya production complies with good technical, sanitary and environmental practices and with European and French regulations


Launched in 2018 by Terres Univia, Interbranch association for vegetable oils and proteins, the **CHARTE SOJA DE FRANCE** was elaborated by the main actors of French soya production and transformation value chain :

seed companies, farmers, grains collectors / elevators , first processors / users.

CHARTE SOJA DE FRANCE in operation :

First soybeans batches and soy products certified available in autumn 2018 ! 50% of French soy production certified within 5 years.

Soya in France

- Increasing areas: 141 000 hectares in 2017 (37 000 hectares in 2012)
- Emerging processing sector
- For food and feed outlets

ightarrow Around 25 000 tons of GM-free soya is used to make French soy foods

 \rightarrow 450 000 tons of GM-free soy meals are consumed each year in France, mainly imported, which could be substituted by more than 200 000 hectares of French GM-free soy crops.
